

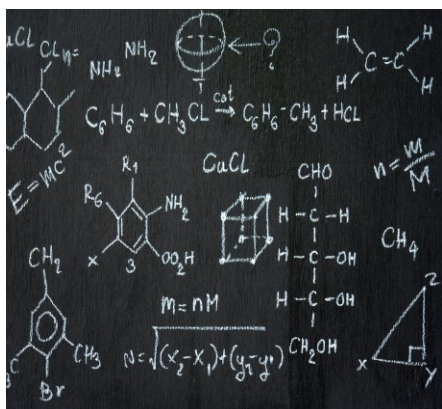
Healthy Watersheds Forest/TMDL Phase III Project



NEEDS ADDRESSED:

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA), Chesapeake Trust, and the State of Virginia Secretary of Forestry and Agriculture sought the reduction of Nitrogen, Phosphorus, and sediment from non-point sources with the retention of existing forestland and agriculture practices.

Working Lands Investment Partners was awarded the highly competitive Healthy Watersheds grant. The purpose of the scope of work was to complete Phase III of the Chesapeake Bay Total Maximum Daily Loads (TMDL)/Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) Implementation Plan.



SOLUTION:

In response to the Bay modal and anticipated continuing negative impacts on water quality, our team developed a public-private model that uses private capital to compensate landowners for land management that reduces Nitrogen, Phosphorus, and sediment loads to the Bay.
